The biggest news of the last year is that Seaford Baptist Church paid off her building debt. Through the faithful tithes and designated offerings of the church, as well as through the sale of the church's cell tower lease, Seaford Baptist has paid off over \$4 million in debt. We are grateful for God's provision.

STABILITY

The financial freedom that Seaford Baptist is now experiencing, combined with a decade of steady leadership in the church body has provided the church with stability. We are now in a position to pursue health and faithfulness while doing our part to fulfill the Great Commission. **We are grateful for God's peace**.

PARTNERSHIPS

This has been a year in which we have endeavored to join arms with other like-minded churches in order to build God's Kingdom. We joined with seven local churches to bring Keith and Kristyn Getty to Bethel Baptist for training and a concert. To build on that project, we will be participating in a multi-church community choir this summer. We are also currently exploring a long-term partnership with the Pillar Church Network--a Southern Baptist association of churches committed to biblical church health, church-planting and revitalization. We are grateful for God's people.

KINGDOM WORK

Three years after COVID hit the scene, we have fully resumed our Kingdom work. Whether it is weekly worship, Midweek discipleship, Gospel Touchpoint outreach events, churchwide meals, mission-work--it has been our joy to fully resume our life together as Seaford Baptist Church. The Campus Improvement Fund represents monies designated for the long-term care of the Seaford Baptist Church campus. Below, the process for how those funds are accessed and used is laid out in accordance with the SBC bylaws.

Long Range Planning Team (LRPT): Ministry team formed by Pastor Michael to make recommendations to the Premises Committee regarding the long-term care of the campus. This team prioritizes major projects. As with all long-range plans, projects may be moved up or back along the timeline based on funding, need, and other factors. These projects are not in the annual budget. Tithes and designated offerings are accrued over time to build up funds for major projects.

Premises Committee - The committee that has oversight of the building and campus maintenance, janitorial duties and responsibilities, lawn maintenance, and landscape, including any church-approved capital improvement projects. This committee receives input from and collaborates with the LRPT to ensure that major and minor projects can be managed and/or supported.

Stewardship Committee - This committee will approve major projects presented by Premises Committee. The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer are consulted throughout the decision-making process.

Bookkeeper - This staff person provides financial information about availability of funds and fiscal health of the church

Church Body - The church will receive updates on findings of the LRPT and the work on projects by the Premises Committee at quarterly Members' Meetings or other times to keep the membership aware of progress/work completed and of proposed projects.

Throughout all of this work our pastors provide leadership. The Church Council and other bodies appointed/elected by the church membership (deacons, trustees, for example) will be kept apprised.

FINANCIAL AREAS OF **EMPHASIS FOR** 2023-2024

Budgetary steps toward church health.

MISSIONS

We want to take the opportunity of being debt-free to further invest in Kingdom work. We will focus on meeting the needs of our career missionaries, adding prayersupported missionaries, exploring new church planting partnerships and increasing denominational giving.

STAFF

We want to continue to build our team at SBC, while ensuring that we are caring for those who are already serving the body vocationally.

CAMPUS

We have built a very large building at Seaford Baptist and now we must be good stewards of it. This will include the wise use of budgeted and designated funds to strategically care for the campus, enabling us to continue using it as a home-base for our mission and a communitycenter for outreach.

Though our pastoral staff trends younger, collectively, they have 18 years of experience shepherding the congregation at Seaford Baptist. Our pastors desire to lead the church well and below is a list of **focus areas** in the life of the church body they are planning and praying for.



Two New Core Values? We are praying about adding two core values to our church's plan for living out our mission and identity. These would include: **Biblical Worship & Intentional Discipleship.**

Local Association? We are praying about Seaford Baptist joining the **Pillar Church Network**--a Southern Baptist network of likeminded churches, working together for church-planting and evangelism.







Personal Pastoral Care?

Our pastors desire to focus on being more hands on in the **care of the souls** of the congregation. We are praying about how this will change our current approaches to ministry.

Spiritual Disciplines?

We believe **spiritual disciplines** are the key to spiritual growth. We are constantly exploring ways we can create and leverage content to mature the body of believers at SBC.





Meaningful Membership? We are working with our deacons to reestablish meaningful membership at Seaford Baptist. This will include reforming the membership process and cleaning up the rolls.
