In March, Pastor Ben and I had the opportunity to attend the Coram Deo Pastor's Conference in Charlotte, NC. It was a three day conference that covered care for your own soul as a pastor, doctrine, church history, suffering in ministry, dealing with politics in the church and caring for the flock. It was truly holistic and renewing for our souls. I'd like to give you three takeaways that I had coming out of the conference.

- 1. The sort of aggressive fight against lust that we Jesus speak of in Matthew 5:27-30 should also be applied to things like pride, self-pity, anger and other sins. This is a daily fight that pastors and all Christians must engage in!
- 2. Pastoral ministry is not easy, but Christ is renewing us day by day, so do not lose heart. This helpful truth was gleaned from John Piper's sermon on 2 Corinthians 4. It was maybe the best sermon I've ever heard on pastoral ministry and suffering.
- 3. Psalm-singing is training for heaven. The worship at the conference was breathtaking. We sang traditional hymns, modern hymns and songs and the Psalms. We sang from Psalm 29, Psalm 42 and Psalm 150 in particular. The Psalms are eternal tunes—the hymn book of Christ. They are the songs of heaven and they prepare us for eternity. We should all endeavor to sing the Psalter personally and with the congregation.

This was probably the best conference I ever attended. Ben and I were blessed by the sermons, panels, prayers and songs. We are thankful to you for sending us. We don't take that for granted and it is our prayer that you will feel the positive effect of it in our pastoral ministry.

We could not do this ministry without each and every one of you that support this mission and outreach. We are now serving 9 families (28 people to include adults and children). We can provide assistance to our SBC families, anyone related to our families, friends of our families and neighbors of our families. With the increased cost of food for families we are here to help. If you know someone that needs assistance, please have them <u>contact the church office</u>. Everything is very discreet in this ministry.

Non perishable food Items can be dropped off Sunday mornings during Bible Study or before Church Services, and Monday - Thursday from 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM. Please place any donations on the big Food Pantry cart in the lobby near the church office. If you are not able to shop you may also make a designated offering to the Food Pantry and we will do the shopping for you. If you are able to help with the items listed below from our food list it would be greatly appreciated by our families.







FOOD ITEM LIST: If you would prefer to shop here is a list of items needed: Cereal (cold), Instant Potatoes, Brownie Mix, Cake Mix and Frosting, Canned Fruit, Apple Sauce, Snacks (i.e. cookies, gold fish, graham crackers, crackers, fruit gummies snacks, chewy bars, small bags of chips, pretzels, cheese or peanut butter crackers), Rice (1lb), Dried Beans (Kidney, Pinto, 15 Bean), Pop-Tarts, Peanut Butter, Jelly (grape or strawberry),

There is a Fall Food List on each of the signup tables in the church.

ALL FOOD DONATIONS MUST HAVE AN EXPIRATION DATE ON THEM TO ALLOW US TO GIVE THEM TO THE FAMILIES WE SUPPORT) The donation must be within 6 months of the original expiration date. If we received food with no expiration date or a date past 6 months of the original date we must throw it out.
